

Journey to Antarctica: The White Continent

Start with an **Overnight flight to Buenos Aires**, where you will enjoy a panoramic city tour with Beaux-Arts palaces, grand boulevards, and the famous balcony associated with Eva Peron

Fly to Ushuaia, the southernmost city in the world.

Embark the National Geographic Explorer, an authentic expedition ship, built for polar expeditions.

Sail thru the **Drake Passage**, named after Sir Francis Drake, set between Cape Horn and the Antarctic Peninsula. This area is rich in marine life.

Then onto Antarctica – the last great wilderness. With nearly 24 hours of daylight, spend 6 days filled with discovering towering icebergs, seeing penguin colonies, hiking to summits with breathtaking views, kayaking a cliff side in search of blue-eyed shags, and hearing the cries of thousands of Gentoo penguins. Get photo tips from a National Geographic photographer.

Sail back to Ushuaia, keeping an eye out for marine life, albatross, and other seabirds. Disembark ship and spend time exploring before preceding to the airport.

Fly to Buenos Aires, then the return flight home.
